THE BIG IDEA

Life can be overwhelming. It can look like a big mess that will never get unknotted or end up like we want it to, so we stress out and worry. It is important to remember that we are not God. We didn't write this story with a sovereign hand and cannot see how it will end in the same way he does. Instead, we must learn to rest in his control and trust him above all else. This is precisely what Mary did when an unexpected plan came her way.

START A CONVERSATION (Use this to begin a Conversation that Matters with your kids, coworkers, spouse, or someone in line at the grocery store. Then, tell us about it.)

Can you tell me of a time when things didn't turn out like you had planned? What'd you do?

SOME THINGS TO THINK ABOUT

- At this time of year, which tasks, relationships, or circumstances have you feeling overwhelmed? How can you practically begin to trust God with those things?
- Mary was encouraged by her relationship with Elizabeth and their shared experience of unexpected pregnancy. Who are you currently walking alongside in the Christian life?
 Who knows your story and is encouraging you regularly? What do you share in common?
- The end of the year is a good time to reflect on how things went. This year we've talked a lot about the 1-3-1 of being a healthy church member. You can read about those markers here. How are you doing in each area? Give yourself a grade and talk with someone about where you've been successful and where you need to improve.

GO DEEPER
