

January 24, 2016 Gifted for the Church by Dr. Richard Rogers Ephesians 4:7-12 (Listen Online)

THE BIG IDEA

God doesn't have a backup plan for making Jesus known. Plan A is the only plan, and Plan A is the church. God has gifted every single Christian with individual talents and abilities that are to be used in fulfilling this mission. And he has placed each believer in a local church on purpose. You are uniquely equipped with gifts from God for ministry in this church, and you must be actively engaged in using them.

SOME THINGS TO THINK ABOUT

- How does your personal relationship with Jesus affect or influence your relationship with the church?
- What gifting, talent, or ability do you have that can be used to help others know Jesus? If you can't think of one, have you ever asked God to show you?
- Who in the church has served you by giving of their time, resources, or talents? How long has it been since you've told them thank you?
- How is unity currently challenged or threatened at University Heights?
- Take a moment to refresh yourself with our <u>One Three One</u> vision for healthy church membership. Which areas are you doing well, and which ones need some work?

GO DEEPER

- Sometimes our commitment to the local church can languish even as we try to grow in relationship with Jesus. Trip Lee helps us understand why this simply won't work.
