Ephesians 4:21-24 (Listen Online)

## THE BIG IDEA

Knowing Jesus changes everything. The Christian life requires that we put to death our old way of living and put on a new way with new aims, attitudes, and actions. This requires a daily enabling of the Spirit that fuels effort on our part, and it begins in our minds. Paul encourages the Ephesians (and us!) to get serious about being remade in the image of God displayed perfectly in Christ.

- What is "the new self" that Paul mentions in v. 24? How do you know?
- Richard mentioned that the way we live must match the reality of who we are. In what
  ways do your daily habits and attitudes not reflect the reality of who you are in Jesus?

## **GO DEEPER**
