August 14, 2016 We Will Make a Difference by Dr. Richard Rogers Matthew 28:19-20 (<u>Listen Online</u>)

THE BIG IDEA

If we want to be a church of people who live outward focused lives, we must commit to making a difference right where we live by being obedience to the call of God. Jesus left clear instructions for us before ascending into heaven, and those instructions will affect our daily life everywhere we go. As a church, we must act in obedience together to make a difference in our community for the glory of God.

- **START A CONVERSATION** (Use this to begin a Conversation that Matters with your kids, coworkers, spouse, or someone in line at the grocery store. Then, <u>tell us about it</u>.)
 - Who has made the biggest difference in your life?

SOME THINGS TO THINK ABOUT

- Now that we've walked through *I Will* in its entirety, we have to ask whether we actually want what it describes. Do you actually want to be an outwardly focused Christian? What things keep you from being more outwardly focused than you currently are?
- Look again at today's passage. Who disciples you? And who are you discipling?
- Do you know an "as you go" follower of Christ? How is their life different from your own?
- Name someone you will encounter this week who needs to know Jesus as their savior. In what practical ways can you fulfill the Great Commission in your relationship with them?
- How is God calling you to be courageously obedient this week?
